Her focus is on helping dancers and dance organizations to develop their brands in order to build sustainable businesses and careers. Danielle created the Ugly Duckling Project, a modern-ballet and residency to address bullying in elementary-age children, set to an original score by the late James Casey; performed and grant-funded through the Pennsylvania Regional Ballet. Danielle has been a member of Avodah Dance Ensemble, Dayton Contemporary Dance Company II, and was a performer, dance captain, and choreographer at Sight & Sound Theatre. Currently, Danielle is a member of the Pennsylvania Dance Educators Organization, serving on the professional development committee. She provides services, courses, and writes about dance at DanielleGuillermo.com.
